“ Probably every student has a few teachers who stand out as having a particular impact, and for me Brian was one of those few. His influence on my education went a good deal beyond the single Shakespeare class I took from him.

Brian was a very demanding teacher, who pushed his students to think. He had a way of turning a simple "How are you?" in the hallway into a lesson on the Socratic method as applied to metaphysics! Often enough, when someone asked him a question about a passage in Shakespeare, his response would be "Well, what do you think?" Then, when he got an answer, he would rather gleefully poke holes in it. He helped me develop my habit of researching my opinions before I form them, and I owe such critical thinking skills as I have in part to Brian's early lessons in high school.

I'm indebted to Brian for pulling a very hard-headed teenager aside and giving him a private scolding one afternoon. I was playing with my mind, he said. Wasting my talents, he said. He was right, of course, and the message sank in. I won't say that that talking-to caused me to do an immediate about-face -- stubborn soul that I was and still can be -- but he helped to set me more firmly on the path of making something of myself, and to like the person that I have become.

Condolences to his loved ones. Brian was one of the great teachers, and I'm sure that he will be much missed.
