Sally Malhoit, born in 1930 to Ava Marie and Forrest Bassett in Beloit Wisconsin, excelled academically and graduated with honors from every school she attended including Northwestern where she met the love of her life, Jack Malhoit.

She hosted her own radio show at WBEL in Beloit, she enjoyed membership in several civic groups, and is remembered by many as an educator at St Angela Hall, McAuley High School, at May Manse College, and the University of Toledo.

Sally was the first lay person in the history of the Catholic Church to hold the position of Vice Chancellor.

Theater was her greatest passion. She began her stage career with her mother, Ava Marie, a consummate actor in her own right. Sally appeared in many productions of Cathedral Players, Village Players and The Rep.

She sang with Jack in the award winning Gesu Ensemble, and the Great Eight will never forget McGillicutty.

While the final curtain has fallen for Jack and Sally's brother, Terry; sisters, Suzanne and Babs, are still appearing nightly.
