Thomas Lester Bolander Sr. passed away at Hospice of Northwest Ohio surrounded by his family on October 30, 2018 at the age of 65.

Thomas was born to Lowell and Myrtle Bolander on July 6, 1953 in Toledo, Ohio. He was a graduate of Waite High School in 1974. He enlisted in the United States Army in 1973 and was discharged under honorable service. Thomas' earlier years he worked as an Iron worker for Local 55. He then fulfilled his dream by becoming the owner of TOM's BBQ & Grill Restaurant for 21 years. He enjoyed owning and operating concessions at local events and was known for his famous fresh squeezed lemonade. When he wasn't working he loved spending time with his family, watching sports, old western movies, traveling, playing cards, and fishing.

Thomas is survived by his loving wife Victoria Bolander of 35 years. They were married at Immaculate Conception Marygrove on July 9, 1983.
