Alex Rapp, age 100 of Toledo, Ohio, passed away on Thursday March 15, 2018 in the Franciscan Care Center where he had been living since August of last year. Alex was born in Toledo, Ohio on November 6, 1917 to Joseph and Eugenia Rapp.

Alex was a graduate of Woodward High School and served in the United States Navy aboard the USS Lexington and the USS Yorktown as a pilot flying over 27 missions. He returned to Toledo and in 1948 married the former Genevieve Whitmore; she preceded him in death in November of 2006. Alex worked for the former Walding, Kinnan and Marvin Pharmaceutical as a sales representative.

Alex is survived by his brother Joseph Rapp; sisters Adela Tremp and Mary (Don) Frick. He is also survived by many nieces and nephews. In addition to his parents and wife, Alex is preceded in death by brothers Eugene, John and Charles; and sisters Mary Anna and Eugenia.
