Allen Marshall Hermann, known to many as Uncle Herm, passed away Tuesday evening, June 1, 2010 in the emergency room at UTMC shortly after being involved in an auto pedestrian accident.

Uncle Herm was born in Detroit, Feb. 17, 1932, lived most of his life in South Toledo retiring in 1994 after 40 years with Penn. Central Conrail railroad.

He attended the University of Toledo. He served in the Air Force during the Korean Conflict where he attained the rank of Chief Master Sergeant. He went back on duty during Desert Storm and was especially proud of his duties as a medic in a 5000 bed hospital in England treating injured Desert Storm vets.

He was a past president of the Local Carman's Railroad Union in Walbridge, OH and through the years active in Masonic circles as a member of Blanchard #102 Blue Lodge in Petersburg, MI, the Otantala Grotto, the Scottish Rite and the Zenobia Temple. He belonged to the Knights of Columbus and the Catholic War Vets.

Uncle Herm was a past member of St. James Catholic Church and was currently a very active member of Immaculate Conception Church where he served on a number of committees.

He was preceded in death by his parents, and brother, David Hermann. Having never married, Uncle Herm will be missed by his loving nieces and nephews, Jan (Jim) Hardy, Ken (Paula) Jarzeboski, Karen Rankin, Deb (Dan) Farbrother, Melvin (Chris) Jarzeboski and many nieces and nephews.
