Bridget Ann Rose Bennett, 66, of Toledo, OH, passed away peacefully on March 8, 2025.

She is survived by her loving husband, David; children, Rebecca Bennett and Ian (Cady) Bennett; cherished grandchildren, Avery, Zoe, Rylan, and Milee; her mother, Agatha Drury; and her brother, Dan (Faryl) Drury, with whom she shared a special bond.
