Carl T. Barrick, 86, of Toledo passed away on Saturday, October 23, 2010 at the Advanced Specialty Hospital, South Toledo. Hospitalized since August after heart surgery, complications set in and took him from us. He is now at peace with family and friends who have preceded him in death.

He was born in Toledo to Joseph and Mary Barrick, January 17, 1924. He was preceded in death by his parents and infant son, Carl and 2 sisters. Carl attended Historic St. Patrick's grade school and graduated from Central Catholic High School in 1942. He loved all of them dearly and especially, the newest grandson, his little buddy, Blake.
