Carol was kind. Calm. Loving. Selfless. Determined. Resilient. Loyal. She was GRIT — through and through.

The oldest of five kids, the first grandchild, and a lifelong best friend to so many — including me. She had a way of showing up for people, not just in the big moments but in the small, quiet, everyday ones that make all the difference. She gave so much of herself — without hesitation, without conditions, — always thinking of others before herself.

Growing up, I remember Carol was responsible for introducing me to great music. Rock music or for a lot of us, CLASSIC rock. I don't know about you, but I prefer to omit “classic” in the reference. I'll never forget the time she was furious with me for taking her Frampton Comes Alive album cover to school. I remember it like it was yesterday. It was 7th GRADE! She was not happy. I am sure that bent right bottom corner of the album cover was forever remembered but quickly forgiven. To this day any reference to Peter Frampton makes me smile because of it. Like most siblings, we had more than our share of fights and disagreements, the kind that all siblings have growing up. Most often we worked it out amongst ourselves and if we didn't, I can assure you we would hear mom say, “I don't care who started it, but I'm finishing it!” Which meant exactly that! We knew we better “knock it off” (whatever IT was). One thing we always joked about was Carol Time. There are four time zones ... and then there's Carol Time. No matter what time we told her a party started — whether padded or precise — she'd show up just a little later than we told her. That was Carol. She did not want to be rushed. And actually, did not allow any of us to rush her. So eventually we learned we could just share one time with

everyone but account for “Carol time” when we told her. But here’s the thing - she showed up. For all of us. Consistently, lovingly, unconditionally. ALWAYS. But a little later than expected.

It goes without saying her greatest love, though, was her family — especially her sons, Brad and Bryant. The bond Carol had with her sons was enviable. She explained things patiently, thoroughly, thoughtfully. She had a parenting style that was both admirable — rooted in love, respect, and calm understanding. A great mother is one that can take the place of everyone but who’s place no one else can take. This was Carol. She lived for her boys. She adored Kelsey like a daughter and was in awe of the amazing young women Bella and Brooklyn are becoming. She could not have loved them more, and she was so incredibly proud of them — always.

Carol truly was the salt of the earth. No one cared more, worked harder, or loved deeper. She was slow to anger and quick to forgive. She looked for joy in everything, and somehow, she always managed to see the best in everyone.

Brad, Bry, Kelsey — we know your mom always wanted the best for you and was unafraid to let you live your own lives. I want you to look around this room today. Life certainly feels heavy now, but please know you are surrounded by love. The kind of love your mom gave so unconditionally. That support doesn’t end today or tomorrow or next week. It’s here — always.

We’re heartbroken, of course. It’s incredibly hard to find peace in our own grief. We miss her already. But we are also so deeply grateful — grateful to have known her, to have loved her, and to have been loved by her.

One friend can change your whole life. For me, and so many others that was Carol —. Her spirit lives on in all of us. Thank you for the memories, the music, the laughter, the love. Thank you for making each of us better. We will carry you with us in our hearts and memories, always.

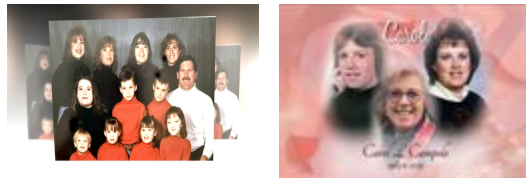
