“ Carol B. Mohler, 79, a retired Toledo special-education teacher, died Monday in Hospice of Northwest Ohio on South Detroit Avenue. Mrs. Mohler died of an unknown, metastasized cancer that wasn't diagnosed until Dec. 17, relatives said. "She was in good spirits," her son Timothy said. "She took it with class. In her last days, she was more worried about my dad and him being taken care of, her dogs, and us." Mrs. Mohler was born Feb. 7, 1935, to Stanley and Maria Kulczak in Toledo. She attended Central Catholic High and the University of Toledo. She met Terence Mohler at a dance in downtown Toledo in 1955, and the couple married about three months later, on Nov. 5. The elder Mr. Mohler said he was "overwhelmed" when he first saw his future bride and asked her to dance. "She was very pretty, a good dresser, a good conversationalist," he said. "I stepped on her feet." Mrs. Mohler was best known for her giving, caring personality. She was a special-education teacher with Toledo Public Schools for 24 years at Harvard, Walbridge, and Beverly elementary schools before retiring in the mid 1970s.

“*She found it very heartwarming to see the kids produce and learn,*” her husband said.

Mrs. Mohler was active in Toledo Roadrunners for at least 30 years and still ran and walked until a few months ago when her health declined.

“She was very athletic, very concerned about her health,” her son said. “She ran a lot and actually qualified for [the Boston Marathon] a few years ago.”

Mrs. Mohler also was committed to the anti-abortion movement as a sidewalk counselor with ProLife Connection, talking to women who were considering abortions.

“She felt it was her duty,” the elder Mr. Mohler said. “She took the insults and the threats and being spit at and all the other things that went along with it.”

Mrs. Mohler also was active in the Toledo Symphony League for at least 15 years.

She is survived by her husband, Terence; sons, Terence and Timothy; daughter, Renee Weaver; brother, Gerald Kulczak; six grandchildren, and two great-grandchildren.

The Coyle Funeral Home is handling arrangements. A memorial Mass will be said at St. Patrick of Heatherdowns Church at 10 a.m. Jan. 6.

The family suggests tributes to the hospice or the church.
