Craig Michael Curley passed away on November 16th, 2021, after a brief battle with cancer. He was born on September 25, 1961 in Toledo. Craig was preceded in death by his mother Nancy Maher Curley and his grandparents. Craig was afflicted with cerebral palsy and autism. Despite all odds, Craig overcame many challenges in the face of diversity. He learned to ride a bike, communicate effectively while excelling at walking and running. As a participant in Special Olympics, he accumulated numerous medals including many gold medals. Affectionately known as "Superman", one of his greatest attributes was his photographic memory. He never forgot a name or face of those he met. He lived and attended Lark Lane for 22 years and found gainful employment and respite care at MRDD Sunshine Children's Home where he enjoyed productive activities and developing a special friendship with Jenny Schneider.

Craig is survived by his father Richard Curley, his aunt Colleen Hiltman, and his stepmother Karen Rose Curley. Additional survivors include many cousins, friends, and his Triad family. The family would like to extend their heartfelt gratitude to Miles O'Keefe, Craig's caregiver and friend of many years.

A Funeral Mass will be held on Monday, November 22 at the Historic Church of St. Patrick at 11:00 a.m., with a visitation beginning at 9:30. Burial will be at Toledo Memorial Park. 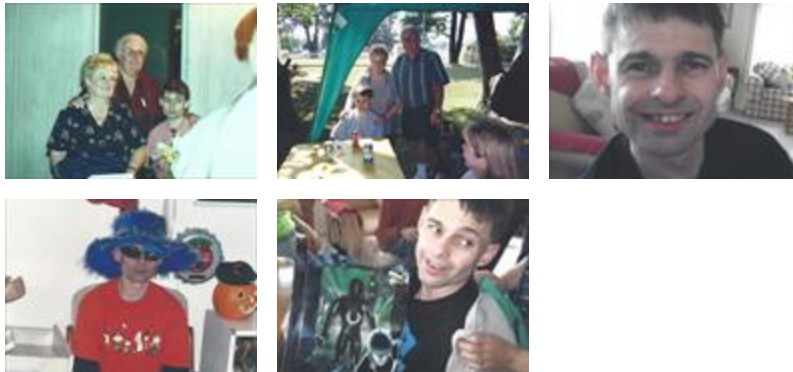
