Dale Everet Hummon, only son and youngest child of John Everet Hummon and Helen Haskell Hummon, passed away on January 1, 2018. He was born in Toledo, Ohio, on October 13, 1947. He lived most of his life in Toledo, attending Nathan Hale Elementary and DeVilbiss High Schools, Class of 1965. From 1966 to 1968, he served in the United States Navy and was honorably discharged. He graduated from the University of Toledo in 1978 with a B.A. in psychology. The Honeywell Corporation was his principal employer; he worked there as a purchasing agent for many years. Later he worked for the Toledo Blade and for Clarke American Lincoln. For much of his life, he was a member of the United Methodist Church. His most endearing quality was his sense of humor, honed to perfection during adolescence. His parents and a half-sister, Betty Hummon Martin, preceded him in death. Surviving are sisters Elaine Dierberger (Jim) and Evelyn Hummon (Connie Hook). Also surviving are niece Trula Mosher (Eric), nephews Steven Dierberger, Brian Dierberger (Penny), Benjamin Tombaugh (Ellen), Frederick Tombaugh (Tonia) and a dear neighbor, Jo Breault.
