November 10, 1930 - August 14, 2012

Edward L. Kelley, age 81 of Toledo passed away on August 14, 2012 at Hospice of Northwest Ohio, Perrysburg.

He was born in Somerville, Massachusetts to John and Marie Kelley on November 11, 1930. He was a graduate of North Quincy High School (1948) and Boston College (1958) where he received his Bachelor of Science. He served his country proudly in the U.S. Army during the Korean War. He spent his career working as a National Accounts Manager for the Union Camp Corporation until the time of his retirement. Ed wanted to spread God's word and love. He was ordained a Deacon in the Catholic Church in 1990. He was quoted as saying, "God has been very good to me and I have a great responsibility to be an extension of that love. I'm anxious to see what plans the Lord has in store for me. I'm listening." He was a member of Gesu Catholic Church, where he was a baseball Coach for the Gesu School for 6 years, St. Vincent DePaul Society, The Sight Center, the Lamplighter's Dance Club. Ed enjoyed traveling, the theatre, ballroom dancing, exercising at St. Luke's Cardiac Care with his good friends. He was an avid member of the Boston Red Sox Nation. Ed was a wonderful husband, father and grandfather. Ed is preceded in death by his first wife, Phyllis; his parents; son, Brian and granddaughter, Morgan.
