Evelyn H. Stoffregen, 91, of Maumee, Ohio, passed away August 27, 2012. A resident of Maumee for almost 50 years, she was born in Cincinnati to Elmer and Alberta Hiller on September 8, 1920. After her husband, Irvin, returned from service in WWII, they moved their family to Atlanta, St. Louis, and Cincinnati before settling in Maumee. A dedicated wife and mother, she was active in St. John's Mother's Club, the Toledo Zoo and other community organizations before commencing what ultimately became a 40-year "second career" in banking and human resources. She held management positions with State Home Savings and First Federal S&L of Delta, and enjoyed 17 years with Kellermeyer Bergensons Services. Evelyn was a generous grandmother and friend, and an avid sports fan, cheering on the Fighting Irish, Buckeyes, Blue Devils, and Demon Deacons.

She was preceded in death by her husband, Irvin, sister Mae Hake, and granddaughter Katie Byrnes. She is survived by her sister Alma Voelckel, son John (Beverly) of Rochester, NY, daughter Jayne (John) Byrnes of Worthington, OH, grandsons Chris Stoffregen and Jack Byrnes, extended family members, and many friends.
