



## Francis William Erd

November 23, 1925 - July 19, 2009

Francis W. Erd, age 83 of Maumee Ohio, died July 19, 2009 in the Elizabeth Scott Nursing Home where he lived for the past year.

Fran was born in Toledo Ohio on Nov. 23, 1925 to George and Nellie Erd Sr. He was a graduate of Libby High School and served in the United States Army during WWII. The war took him to Europe where he was a member of the 66th infantry Division also known as "The Black Panther Division". Fran was awarded 2 Purple Hearts before he turned 19. He survived the sinking of the Leopoldville, a merchant ship transporting troops across the English Channel on Christmas Eve in 1944. The ship was hit by a German torpedo and left him in the freezing cold water until help arrived. Eight hundred men were lost. Fran also received a Bronze Star for valor.

After he served two and a half years in Europe he returned to Toledo and married the former Beatrice Groves on July 27, 1952. They were married for 38 years. He was a truck driver for the former Buckeye Cartage Company and then for Buckeye Furniture Company before becoming a part owner of the business.

Fran enjoyed playing fast pitch baseball with his friends at the Twins Caf? and Steve's Bar. He was Notre Dame fan and reading was his favorite past times. He was known as a very friendly man who enjoyed talking to others. He was

not a religious person but he lived a Gospel life.

Fran was preceded in death by his wife Beatrice, his parents; brothers George, Art, Bob, Ray and Rich Erd and his sister Helen Rose Koberstein. He is survived by many loving nieces and nephews.
