



Frederick A. Sprenger

January 27, 1909 - July 30, 2010

Frederick A. Sprenger, age 101 of Toledo, OH, passed away on July 30, 2010. He was born to Anthony and Gertrude Sprenger on January 27, 1909. He was a graduate of Central Catholic High School and attended the University of Notre Dame. Fred then enlisted in the U.S. Navy where he served his country proudly during WWII and was honorably discharged as a Lieutenant Commander. He then spent his career working with his father, A.O. and his brother, George owning and operating the Sprenger Men's Wear stores. During the 70's he also became a Land Developer where owned the Sprenger Grub Land Corporation in Sun Valley, Idaho and the Sprenger Spath Corporation in Monroe, Mi.

He was a longtime honorary member of the Sylvania Country Club and longtime member of the Toledo Club. He was an uncle to 6 boys and a great-uncle to 21 nieces and nephews.

Fred was preceded in death by his parents, brothers, George A. Sprenger and Monsignor Albert C. Sprenger. He is survived by his sister, Gertrude Meehan, of Dearborn, MI; nephews, Tom (Patricia), Albert (Marcia), Patrick, George (Mary Ellen), Mark (Nancy) Sprenger and George (Cheryl) Meehan.

A Funeral Mass will be held on Monday, August 2, 2010 at Gesu Catholic Church, 2049 Parkside Boulevard, Toledo, OH 43607 at 11 a.m. where the family will begin receiving friends at 10 a.m. Interment Calvary Cemetery.
