Geneva P. Ramseur, 101, a resident of the Swan Creek Retirement Village, passed away on October 20, 2015.

Born on May 27, 1914, she was the daughter of the late Charles and Beatrice (Hollaway) Bennett. She married Ronald Kieffer on March 12, 1940 and he preceded her in death on August 1, 1949. She then married Kenneth M. Ramseur on May 30, 1960 and he preceded her in death on March 3, 1991.
