Glenn J. Frische passed away on January 8, 2012 in the Hospice of Northwest Ohio, Toledo Center. He had suffered from Alzheimer's disease since 2004. Born on November 12, 1926 in Toledo, Ohio, to Anna and George Frische, he attended Our Lady of Perpetual Help (OLPH) elementary school and graduated from Central Catholic High School in 1946 and attended the University of Toledo. Glenn served our country as a Navy corpsman in World War II. After an honorable discharge from the Navy, he held several different jobs including a sales position at WTOD. However, most of his career was spent as an account executive at WSPD, where he remained until his retirement in 1991

A natural lover of people, Glenn thoroughly enjoyed his years with WSPD. During his professional life, he was active in numerous organizations including Toledo's Professional Businessmen's Club (President 1968-1971), the Toledo Chamber of Commerce, and the Maumee River Yacht Club, where he served on the board of directors. In 1954 Glenn married Bernadine (Bebe) Baron; they spent many years traveling, entertaining and enjoying each other's company. They were blessed with one son, Steven Frische.

Glenn was preceded in death by his parents and his sister, Jean Ann Bench. Besides his wife Bebe, he is survived by loving, caring son Steven (Darlene) Frische, grandchildren Kyle and Mindy Frische; brother Dale Frische and many nieces and nephews.
