



## Helen Mae Dickman

October 12, 1918 - April 2, 2011

Helen Mae Dickman, age 92, of Maumee, died Saturday, April 2, 2011 in her home. She was born October 12, 1918 in Mercy Hospital, Toledo to Richard and Theresa (McNeil) Dickman. A graduate of Gesu School, Central Catholic High School, Mercy School of Nursing, Mary Manse College and Wayne State University, Detroit, Miss Dickman worked as a staff and private duty nurse from 1939 until 1945 when she began teaching at Mercy School of Nursing, serving as its director from 1973 until her retirement in 1981.

She was the recipient of the Larkin Medal for Clinical Excellence in 1939 from Mercy School of Nursing, the 1994 Misericordia et Cura Honor from Mercy College of Northwest Ohio and the Golden Shamrock Award in 1996 from Central Catholic High School. Helen Mae enjoyed reading, sewing, cooking, traveling, gardening, sports, and any kind of card game. She was a tireless volunteer for many community organizations and a friend to all in need. She leaves a legacy of faith, compassion, and humor for everyone who was blessed to have known her.

Helen Mae was preceded in death by her parents, and brothers Richard and Robert. She is survived by her nephews Richard (Carol Ann) Dickman and Donald (Carol) Dickman, both of Florida; grand nephew Jason Dickman; step-niece Linda (Jim) Simmons, and many loving cousins.
