I first met John when I was given his name and number as a person who could help me get food for a family I was trying to help and they could not get any assistance. I called John, and set-up an appointment to meet with him at his home. What an experience that was for me. He took me to his garage/barn/shed. In addition to receiving 4 bags of groceries from meat to fresh produce, I learned about the underground food network he had created years ago. While there a young man drove up. Got out of his car. Called John, Mr. Didion and was quickly corrected to call him John. John gave him 4 bags of groceries for his family for the week. John told me after the young man left, that he was a graduate of St. John's, had his Bachelors and had lost his job a month ago, had a wife and two children, working odd jobs until he could land something in his field of experience and getting these groceries every week helped to stretch the young man's unemployment check. During my visit, more men came and got more groceries, and I learned a lot about "bare bones charity" and the underground food network. This was my 1st visit with John and I am humbled and honored to say I was able to have many more conversations/discussions with John since that time.

Shortly after our Council was started, John called me and told me he was a Knight and wanted to transfer to our Council. I was not surprised when I learned how long he had been a Knight. John was for me, a true example of a Knight, one which I hope I mirror as a Knight.

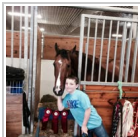
