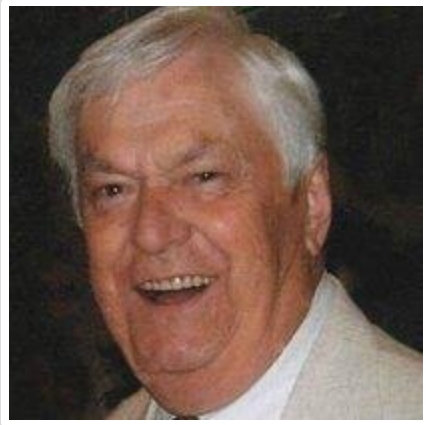




Joseph J. Docis

Joseph Docis, 78, passed away Saturday May 11, 2013 at his home in Toledo, surrounded by his loving family.

Born March 8, 1935 (on a caboose, according to Joe) in Waukegan, IL to John and Anna (Burba) Docis, he moved to Toledo with his family at a young age, attending OLPH elementary and Central Catholic High, graduating in 1953. He married Marleen Rybarczyk in 1957 and began working at Columbia Gas of Ohio shortly thereafter. Joe worked at "Big Gas" for well over thirty years, retiring in 1997. He also spent many years as bartender at Haddad's Bungalow during the 1960's and 70's.
