Larry Kohlenberg, 77, of Maumee, Ohio, passed away in April 2026. Born November 18, 1948, in Ironton, Ohio, he was preceded in death by his wife, Sandy, and his brother, Glenn.

A graduate of Eastwood High School and Bowling Green State University, Larry built a successful career in the mobile home industry working with his father, Ray, operating K & K Homes and developing the Friendly Village parks across northwest Ohio. He later owned The Top Floor Restaurant and, in 1999, developed and patented a water-treatment device to remove sulfur and iron from drinking water, selling the equipment through Larry's Water Conditioning (LWC Ltd.) with his son Terry until his retirement in 2024.

Larry loved anything to do with cars-especially drag racing-cooking, wine, and playing Gin Rummy. Above all, he cherished time spent with family and friends.

He is survived by his sons, Terry and Christopher; his daughter, Jodi; his daughter-in-law, Erin; and his brothers, Phil and Vernon.
