Lawrence "Larry" E. Trausch age 75 of Toledo, joined the Lord in heaven on Monday May 21, 2012 unexpectedly in his home. A U.S. Marine veteran of the Korean War, Larry worked at General Motors for many years. After his retirement, he worked at the Kroger's on S. Detroit and Glendale. He was a member of the Corda Club, where he met his wife, St. Vincent de Paul Society, where he received the Top Hat Award, and the Feed Your Neighbor Program at St. Patrick of Heatherdown's Church. Larry also served as a lay minister and usher at St. Patrick's Church and was a lay minister at UTMC for many years. He was also a 4th. Degree member of the Knights of Columbus and was active in Retroville.

Larry was preceded in death by his parents Clarence and Mary Trausch; sisters Phyllis and Janet and brother Kevin. He is survived by his wife of 39 years Dolores; daughter Lisa (Jason) Phillips; granddaughter Zoe and brother John as well as nieces and nephews.
