Louis E. Kovacs of Sylvania, Ohio passed away July 3, 2009. Lou was born in Toledo, Ohio on October 25, 1919 to Stephen and Mary Kovacs, butcher shop owners in East Toledo. Lou helped his parents at the market during his high school years at Waite and after graduation. His ability in math led to a career in Accounting with Buckeye Brewery and later as an Auditor for the State of Ohio. During WWII he was a Supply Sergeant in Army Air Force serving primarily in India for the Burma Air Lift.

Lou married Mary Jeanette Pinkleman in 1953 and they remained married for over 53 years. Mary Jeanette passed away on May 30, 2006. In 1954 they were "blessed" with twin boys, Terrance and Lawrence. In 1957, a daughter, Bonnie Marie was born to complete the family.

Lou was a loving and hard-working husband, father and friend. He was a sports enthusiast who had a life long passion for the Detroit Tigers, Notre Dame and Ohio State athletics. Lou was an excellent golfer who had a hole in one at the age of 78 at Ottawa Park.
