



Lowell "Whitey" Steusloff

October 3, 1923 - February 27, 2014

Lowell "Whitey" Steusloff, of Waterville, Ohio, passed away on February 27, 2014 at home. He was born on October 30, 1923 to Edward and Elizabeth Steusloff. He attended Libbey High School graduating in 1941 and the next year joined the Army Air Corps serving in the 96th Depot Repair Squadron on the 8th and 9th Air Force during World War II.

Whitey spent most of his Army career in the European theater stationed in England, then landing at Utah Beach after the invasion and finally witnessing the liberation of Paris after which his unit was sent to Germany. He was discharged from the Army on his 22nd birthday which he said was the best gift he ever received.

After working for the Bell Telephone Company and the Mather Springs Company, Whitey started his own business, Steler Corporation, where he represented companies selling automobile parts. He was the sole employee of Steler and continued in the business until his 79th birthday.

Whitey will be remembered for his positive attitude and eternal optimism. He valued his many friends and always enjoyed being part of the POETS at Toledo Country Club and his Waterville Coffee Klatch. He was a member of the Royal Order of Jesters-Court 21, Toledo Country Club, Carronor Club, Greenwood Country Club, South Carolina, and the Toledo American Legion Post.

Whitey is preceded in death by his wife Wilma, and brother Robert.

Services will be private. A celebration of his life will be held from 3-5 p.m. on

Sunday, March 9, 2014 at the Carranor Hunt and Polo Club 502 East Second Street, Perrysburg, Ohio.
