Donna died August 3, 2012 at the age of 96 at Swan Creek Retirement Village where she had lived for 13 years.

She was born in Deshler, Ohio to Anna and Lawrence Bernard Feehan. After graduation from Deshler High School, she moved to Toledo to attend St. Vincent's School of Nursing. Donna completed her R.N. degree in 1937. She worked in local hospitals, in private duty and in the office of Dr. Edward McCormick. Her last position was in the heart catheterization lab at The Toledo Hospital.

In 1941 at Holy Rosary Cathedral Donna married Philip Hoag, a local attorney. He preceded her in death in 1956. She remarried at Gesu Church in 1960 to Matthew Smith, a chemical engineer with Owens Illinois. He preceded her in death in 2008.

Donna and Matt wintered in Venice, Florida for 15 years. They enjoyed cruising and loved to travel. They explored Europe, Alaska, Hawaii and the Caribbean, often in the company of good friends. Donna was an avid bridge player who was also active with the St. Vincent's School of Nursing alumnae, Gesu Church Sodality and Mobile Meals. She served on the board of St. Anthony's Villa and was happily involved in many activities at Swan Creek Retirement Village.

She was preceded in death by her parents, her husbands and her six siblings, William, Geraldine, John, Bernard, James Cletus and Richard Feehan. Donna is survived by her three daughters, Kathy (Adel) Eltimsahy, Jacksonville, Florida, Melanie (Dennis) Cassady, Sammamish, Washington, Melinda (Richard) Meyer, Leesburg, Virginia and her son, Phil Hoag (Mary Carroll Alderman), Baltimore, Maryland. Also surviving are ten grandchildren and ten great grandchildren.
