



## Marian Magdalene Wells

June 8, 1920 - June 15, 2009

Miss Marian M. Wells, 89 years, formerly of Harvest Lane, passed away Monday morning June 15, 2009 at the Franciscan Care Center.

The daughter of Charles and Mary (Schetter) Wells, she was born in Toledo June 8, 1920.

Marian was a Notre Dame Academy graduate and completed her college degree at Mary Manse College.

A lifelong teacher, Marian taught elementary school for the Ottawa Hills schools 37 years retiring in 1984, where she was affectionately known as "The General" by her co-workers.

Through the years she was a member of Gesu Church, St. Anthony's Villa, the St. Lucy Society/Inner Vision, the Catholic Collegiate, the State of Ohio Retired Teachers Association, Lucas County Retired Teachers, the St. Vincent Hospital Auxiliary and Sama Gama. She was a Notre Dame Associate.

She led a very full life and was a generous and giving person.
