Mary C. Parr, 90 years, formerly of Westway Drive died Thursday afternoon, January 25, 2001 in the Lake Park Nursing Care Center.

As a career person, Miss Parr worked for Owens-Illinois for 42 years. Prior to her retirement, she had been Executive Secretary for 26 years to Mr. J. Preston Levis, President and then Chairman and Chief Executive Officer for the company. After her retirement, Miss Parr still worked as personal secretary to Mrs. J. Preston Levis.

Miss Parr was a church organist for various churches in the Toledo area having played for 51 years at St. Joseph's Catholic church at Erie & Locust Streets, retiring from there in March of 1982.

She was a member of the golden Emblem Club of O-I retirees, of St. Vincent's Hospital Guild and a volunteer at the hospital for 12 years.

Miss Parr is survived by her brother Edward L. (Nan) Parr of Lakehurst, NJ and several nieces and nephews. Her brother, George B. Parr and sister Rose C. Zimmerman, preceded her in death.
