



Maurice "Mo" Seiple, II

October 9, 1924 - April 25, 2010

Maurice "Mo" Eugene Seiple, II passed away at his home on April 25, 2010, surrounded by his loving wife and family after suffering his second stroke. He was born on October 9, 1924 in Cleveland, Ohio to the late Dr. Maurice E. Seiple and Irma Cochenour Seiple. He was preceded in death by an infant sister and Patricia Pore Seiple, the mother of his children and his first wife. Mo was a 1942 graduate of Fostoria High School and completed his freshman year at Denison University and in August 1943 he was drafted into the United States Army. While in the Army during World War II, he served in Belgium, France and was attached to the 156th Field Hospital as a Medic during the Battle of the Bulge. He returned in 1946 and completed his degree in 1949 at Bowling Green State University where he was one of the Founding Fathers of the Sigma Chi Chapter and the Captain of the golf team. He was recently honored as a Varsity Bowling Green Lifetime Member. He worked in sales most of his life. For many years he was the Administrative Director of Sales for Crestview Club Apartments, a retirement complex associated with Flower Hospital. Mo's family came first in his life but he loved and had a great passion for the game of golf. He was a long time member of Heatherdown's Country Club and won the club championship in 1955. He was also a member of Brandywine Country Club. His many friends envied the fact that Mo was a scratch golfer. His other love was hunting. When the leaves turned in the fall, Mo, his dad and his dad's dog Tash waded through brush in Upper Michigan looking for

grouse.

He is survived by his loving wife, Nancy "Mick"; children, Elizabeth Seiple Myers and Maurice "Bo" Seiple; step-children, Dr. Daniel J. (Mariam Alherimi) Dilworth, John P. (Ann) Dilworth and Dawn Dilworth (Brandon) Strong; grandchildren, Jake Myers, Cpl. Joseph Myers, Katlyn Myers, Ashley Seiple; all the Dilworth grandchildren and great-grandchildren and his sister, Sally Seiple Daughton, of Phoenix, Arizona.
