



Max Powell

April 14, 1919 - March 8, 2016

The greatest generation dwindled by one on March 8, 2016 when Max C. Powell passed away at the Sunset House in Toledo, OH. He was born April 14, 1919 in Findlay, OH to Forrest and Marilyn Powell. Max grew up in Indianapolis and later moved to St. Louis, Missouri where he attended the University of Missouri, working a number of jobs to pay his tuition. While attending college he met Jane Windsor a recent graduate of Christian College. They would marry after WWII and spend the rest of their lives together until her death in 2008. After 3 years as an undergraduate, Max enrolled in law school there and graduated in 1942 with the LLB degree. When WWII started, Max volunteered for the U.S. Navy V-7 program. He was given time to finish law school and passed the Missouri Bar in 1943. After the Navy, he moved to Toledo and began his law practice with the firm Welles, Kelsey, Coburn and Harrington. In 1947, Max was offered a position with Owens-Illinois where he remained until he retired in 1982.

There are no immediate survivors.
