Nicholas D. Batt, a real estate broker who was in the spotlight for more than two decades - as a law student running for office, as a Lucas County assistant prosecutor, and as Oregon law director battling expansion of a hazardous-materials landfill - died July 4 in ProMedica St. Luke's Hospital, Maumee. He was 63. He had coronary artery disease, according to death certificate information released by the Lucas County Health Department. The Springfield Township resident held a current state real estate broker's license. On his LinkedIn profile, Mr. Batt said his brokerage, Dreh Co., worked with investors and business tenants and invested in real estate and construction businesses. He contributed blog posts to a local faith-and-values website since early 2014 and through the years was a regular contributor to The Blade "Readers' Forum." "He was a man of his convictions. A devout man. A sincere man," said Chuck Childers, whose pawn shop is two blocks from Mr. Batt's former real estate office. "He was a loyal friend to me." The son of Zenith and Dan Batt, he was born May 6, 1952. His father was a longtime Defiance County common pleas judge. Mr. Batt was a graduate of Defiance High School and Purdue University. While a University of Toledo law student, he ran unsuccessfully in 1974 as a Democratic candidate for the Ohio Senate and, two years later, for the Ohio House of Representatives. He was a deputy county auditor who became an assistant prosecutor after graduating from law school in 1976. The Toledo JayCees named him a finalist for Outstanding Young Man in 1980, the year then-Prosecutor Anthony Pizza appointed him chief of the civil division. Within two years, Mr. Batt was village solicitor for Holland and partner in a private law firm. In 1984, he resigned his county post to become Oregon's law director, although he remained as Holland's solicitor. Mr. Batt was frequently in the news as he mounted Oregon's legal case against expansion of what became Envirosafe Services, a hazardous-waste landfill. Survivors include his son, Adam Batt .
