Over the years, Nick's professional life spanned a wide variety of occupations as well. He worked at a music studio for a time, he also worked at a farm to

table style restaurant in North Carolina, a place that really took on his personality after a while. He even briefly worked at one of those weird sweepstakes joints you used to see everywhere before the regulations were passed that closed most of them down. I remember he was given a handgun for protection and was told to keep giving the patrons free beer.

The trick to winning he said was to vary your bet every time. So, if you didn't learn anything else from reading this, there you go.

But he will be remembered most as a handy man. Nick's last job was maintaining apartment buildings in North Carolina. He showed real ability in overcoming the myriad difficulties inherent in that line of work. It satisfied him, so he did it for a while.
