



## Robert Francis Navarre

February 27, 1920 - January 30, 2018

Robert F. Navarre 97, a lifelong Toledo resident, died on January 30, 2018 at Ohio Living, Swan Creek. Bob was born in Toledo on February 27, 1920 to Francis W. Navarre and Marie G. (Egan) Navarre.

Bob entered the United States Army on December 19, 1941 and served four years, two of which were in the European Theater. He was assigned to the 851st. Ordnance Heavy Equipment, Maintenance Division of the 3rd. Army, commanded by General Patton in England, and stayed with him throughout key battles on the mainland, including the battle of the Bulge.

Bob began working for the Devilbiss Co. in 1938 and retired 43 years later, in 1981. As a welder-machinist, he achieved the highest efficiency rating in the history of the company.

He was preceded in death by his wife of almost sixty years, Eileen Fehser Navarre, father Frank, mother Marie; sisters Ethel Lane, Aileen Dale, Betty Barret, Patricia Cassidy Wintemberg, Joan Metzger, Mary Ann Navarre and Marilyn Navarre and brothers Ralph and Richard. He is survived by his brother Thomas and sister Marion King as well as numerous nieces and nephews.

Funeral Services will be held on Saturday February 3, 2018 in Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church at 11:00 am. where the family will receive visitors beginning at 10:15 am. Interment will follow in Calvary Cemetery. The family would like to thank the staff at Swan Creek for their excellent care.
