Sue Straub, lifelong Toledoan, loyal graduate of Central Catholic High School, daughter of the late Edward L. and Mary Claire Straub, died on Saturday, December 4, 2021 after a long battle with Parkinson's disease. She was 78. Supported to the end by her many friends from Central Catholic, St. Patrick of Heatherdowns Catholic Parish, she was given loving care to the end by Luther Home of Mercy professionals, Hospice of Northwest Ohio, and by developmental disabilities programs.

She is survived by her brother, John C. Straub, and beloved sister-in-law, Harriet F. Adams, of Washington, D.C., and many other kin. She was predeceased by her siblings, Michael, Jean and Bill Straub.
