Terry Allen Barber, age 84 of Sylvania, OH, peacefully passed away at Kingston Care in Sylvania, after a long series of health issues.

He was born on February 5, 1936, in Wauseon, OH, to William and Charlotte (Stensen) Barber. He graduated from Wauseon High School where he excelled in athletics and went on to attend Ohio University in Athens. He was a member of Pi Kappa Tau fraternity. He transferred his senior year to Ohio State University and graduated in August 1960 with a degree in Business Administration and also joined the National Guard. Terry started his banking career at First National Bank which became Fifth Third Bank and continued there until retirement.
