



## Terry D. Schroeder

January 26, 1943 - January 21, 2022

Terry D. Schroeder, age 78 of Toledo, passed away peacefully while surrounded by his family on January 21, 2022.

He was born to Kenneth and Mary (Hein) Schroeder on January 26, 1943. He was a graduate of Macomber High School and the University of Toledo where he received his Master's degree in Education. He also proudly served his country in the U.S. Army Reserves. He married the love of his life, Lucinda Mauk, on May 18, 1968 and together they raised 3 sons. He became a Toledo Police Officer in 1965 and was a founding member of the Rifle Team (which predated the SWAT Team). As Captain he cherished his career leading the Toledo Police Academy and graduated many classes. After his retirement, Terry's passion was working in the yard, painting and woodworking. He passed his artistic talents onto his grandchildren. Most of all, he enjoyed camping and spending time with his children and grandchildren.

Terry was preceded in death by his parents. He is survived by his loving wife, Lucinda; sons, Matt (Jill), Mark (Sara) and Jason (Lauren) Schroeder; grandchildren, Paige, Libby, Ebba, Nora, Oliver, Scarlett, Crosby and Greta and sister-in-law, Diane Davis.
