April 13, 1929 - July 22, 2014

Thomas Lester McNerney, 85, passed away peacefully surrounded by his family on Tuesday, July 22, 2014. He was born on April 13, 1929, in Toledo, OH. He graduated from Central Catholic High School and received his Bachelor of Science degree in Geology from St. Joseph's College in Rensselaer, IN. Tom, an avid golfer, was a long-time member of Heatherdowns Country Club where he was 5 time club champion. He was a pillar of the Heatherdowns Country Club golfing community. Tom was also a member at Stone Oak Country Club and Innisbrook Resort & Golf Club, Palm Harbor, FL. He served as President of the Toledo District Golf Association for one term and volunteered his time to rate golf courses in several states along the east coast for the USGA. He was a Notre Dame Football season ticket holder for 40 years and was not shy about telling people why Notre Dame is the best football team and teaching institution in the nation (Go Irish!). Tom was extremely generous and had a great sense of humor! Often described as a character, he had a special way of turning everyday moments into infectious laughter! Tom successfully ran O'Connell Machine & Tool Company, a family business, for 32 years.

Tom was a long-time parishioner of St. Patricks of Heatherdowns, and most recently, a parishioner of Our Lady of Lourdes and St. Luke's, Palm Harbor, FL.

Tom is preceded in death by his parents, Lester and Ruth McNerney, his loving wife Phyllis Jean, and youngest son, Kevin. He is survived by his children, Tom (Nancy), Carol, Mary Pat Bartoszek, Cathleen Henning (Jody), Jim (Marianne), Kelley Johnson (Bruce), Amy Jasinski (John) and Kevin's wife Kris (Carl). “ *(News article) Thomas L. McNerney, 85, a geologist and a noted amateur golfer who became general manager of a family company, died July 22, in Hospice of Northwest Ohio, Perrysburg Township. He had dementia and was injured in a recent fall, his son Jim said. Mr. McNerney, a longtime South Toledoan, lived since February at St. Clare Commons in Perrysburg. He and his late wife, Phyllis Jean, were former residents of Palm Harbor, Fla. He retired in about 1990 when the family sold O'Connell Machine & Tool Co., which was founded in 1950 by James C. O'Connell, his father-in-law. He became general manager of the firm in 1963 after Mr. O'Connell's death.*

“ Mr. McNerney worked as a geologist in Colorado and Kansas. His employers included Bechtel Corp., the construction and engineering giant. He and his wife, both Toledo natives, returned home in the mid-1950s. He started as an apprentice tool maker in his father-in-law's firm, which counted Owens-Illinois and RCA among its customers. He drew on that experience when he took charge. "He had to quickly go out and find the opportunities and sell the work and quote the jobs," his son said. "He wouldn't be able to quote the jobs unless he knew what it took to do the work. "Most evenings after dinner, with family activity swirling around him, Mr. McNerney sat at the kitchen table for hours to work out job quotations, his son said. He liked dealing with people, and the feeling was mutual. "He wasn't afraid to share his opinion, and even if you disagreed with him, you liked him for some reason," his son said. In retirement, Mr. McNerney was a volunteer golf course rater for the U.S. Golf Association. Several days a week he and a team traveled to a course, mostly in eastern states, and measured the physical features and computed degrees of difficulty. Then he and the team played the course and assessed whether the course's ratings and handicaps were appropriate, his son said.

“ He was about 7-years-old when his father first took him out to hit golf balls.

"He took a liking to it," son Jim said. "And then he caddied, and then played the game."

His home course became Heather Downs Country Club, where he was champion multiple times in the 1960s and '70s. He also was a regular in the Toledo District Golf Association's amateur tournaments, and he served a term as the association's president.

Born April 13, 1929, to Ruth and Lester McNerney, he was a graduate of Central Catholic High School. He received a bachelor's degree in geology from St. Joseph's College, Rensselaer, Ind. He was a 40-year season ticket holder for University of Notre Dame football.

His wife died Nov. 27, 2006. Their youngest son, Kevin, died in 2004.

Surviving are his sons, Tom and Jim; daughters, Carol McNerney, Mary Pat Bartoszek, Cathleen Henning, Kelley Johnson, and Amy Jasinski; sisters, Jean Chennges, Janet Harper, and Joan O'Connor; brother, Don; 24 grandchildren, and 12 great-grandchildren.
