Virginia Catherine Bolduan (nee Ronan), age 107, of Toledo, passed away peacefully at her home surrounded by family on November 8, 2020. Virginia (aka "Veebs") was born on October 18, 1913 in Toledo to Joseph and Ida Ronan. Virginia graduated from Waite High School in 1931. She married Herbert F. Bolduan May 2, 1935 and enjoyed 59 years of marriage together until Herb's death. Herb and Virginia raised four sons: Jack Bolduan, James (Judy) Bolduan, Jeffrey (Nadine) Bolduan and Jerry (Paul) Bolduan. She was an inspirational Grandma to Jana (Spencer) Lomax, Cortney (Matthew) Carpenter, Kate (Michael) Gershenson, Alyssa (Alexander) Schneider, Jennifer (Scott) Dahlgren, and Joshua (Jenna) Bolduan. Proud "GG B" to Townes, Althea, and Lincoln Lomax; Sloane, Samuel, and Fletcher Carpenter; Cecelia and Delphine Gershenson; Colby and Chloe Dahlgren; and Hannah, Tenley and Joshua Jr. (TJ) Bolduan. Virginia's proud accomplishments included leading a Girl Scout Troop at Raymer School, Red Cross Nursing at "old Riverside Hospital" during World

War II, volunteering for many civic organizations and supporting many charities. After focusing on her marriage and raising four sons, Virginia embarked on a career as a Licensed Practical Nurse at the age of 49 and worked at Toledo Hospital into her 70's. "Veebs" was a lady with a big heart, great sense of humor, and deep love for her family, close friends, OSU football and the occasional Rum and Diet Coke. She enjoyed family celebrations, traveling, sewing, knitting, reading, gardening, and spending time with her friends through Concordia Lutheran Church, Wednesday Compass Club, and her quilting group. She moved once in her lifetime "from the East side to the South side" of Toledo.
