William A. Bruecken, 87, died June 23, 2020 at his home in Laguna Woods, Ca. after a courageous battle with lymphoma. Bill graduated from the University of Pittsburgh with an engineering degree, and later served in the US. Army as an engineer for 2 years. Bill was married to the love of his life, Donna for 49 years until her passing in 2003. The family moved from Pittsburgh to Toledo in 1971, Bill resided there until 2006. Bill was employed with Surface Combustion Div- Midland Ross Corp. for 30 years until retirement in 2001.

Bill has had a strong Catholic faith and was an active parishioner at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church in Toledo. In 2006 Bill moved to Laguna Woods, Ca. Bill was known for his passionate smile and contagious laughter as he was always surrounded by friends and family on his infamous porch.
